The Winnetka Neighborhood Council Outreach & Social Media Committee holds its regular meetings on the second Tuesday of every month and may also call any additional required special meetings in accordance with its Bylaws and the Brown Act. The agenda for a regular or special meeting is posted for public review within Winnetka, 91306, at the following location: **Winnetka Recreation Center**, 8401 Winnetka Ave.; and might also be posted at: **Winnetka Bowl**, 20122 Vanowen St., **Express Pack & Ship**, 7657 Winnetka Ave., **Fulton Cleaners**, 20109 Roscoe Blvd., **Gil's Barber Shop**, 20433 Sherman Way.

The public may comment on a specific item listed on this agenda when the Board considers that item. When the Board considers the agenda item entitled "Public Comments," the public has the right to comment on any matter that is not specifically listed on this agenda yet is within the Board's jurisdiction. The public is requested to fill out a "Speaker Card" to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action. The Speaker Card ensures that each speaker's name is complete and correct in the meeting's Minutes. Public Comment is limited to 3 minutes per speaker, but the Board has the discretion to modify the amount of time for any speaker. Before a Board vote on any item, any member of the public who has not filled out a Speaker Card will be accorded 1 minute to make a statement. This period will last no longer than 5 minutes total.

1. Meeting convened at 7:14 with Madison Lamoreaux absent.
2. **Holiday Meet and Greet:** Holiday refreshments were served.
3. **Public Comments:** Merry Christmas from John Poer.
4. **Chair's Report:** Eric Lewis gave his report.
5. **Vice-Chair's Report:** Kathleen Pelaez gave her report.
6. Approval of November minutes was tabled.
7. Discussion and possible action regarding the vacancies on this committee: Kathleen and Erick Lace both have people who may be interested in joining the committee.
8. Discussion and possible action regarding memorializing Marilyn Robinson: The committee discussed ideas including a park bench at Winnetka park, renaming the WNC bulletin board and including "Marilyn's corner" in all of the publications.
9. Continued discussion regarding updates and status of WinnetkaNC.com and all other forms of social media in use or to be used by the WNC or the WNC OSM committee: Holly Poer mentioned that there needs to be more topical tweeting on the twitter account and the Facebook status updates.
10. Discussion and possible action regarding the WNC Constant Contact distribution list, and the city's Early Notification System (ENS) distribution list was tabled until Constant Contact is up and running again.
11. Discussion regarding establishing a lecture series to be held at these committee meetings periodically in 2015 as well as potential speakers or presentations for future general WNC board meetings, such as recently elected or re-elected politicians: The committee decided that we would have a speaker for the February meeting on the topic of health and fitness and possibly in March on safety.
12. Discussion regarding WNC outreach events, such as weekend meet & greets, bowling nights, or speaking at local organizations (schools, PTAs, CoCs, fraternal groups, etc.).
13. Discussion regarding the need for flyers for any upcoming WNC events.
14. Discussion regarding a "Walk Winnetka" program was tabled.
15. Discussion regarding a general-use outreach flyer: Format and content were discussed.



16. **Good of the Order:** Discussion regarding a school board election debate in February and whether or not we should support the event financially.
17. **Future Agenda Items & other Calendar Events:** Next meeting January 27th.

PROCESS FOR RECONSIDERATION

The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for Reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action.

If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a {Proposed} Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken can only make a motion for reconsideration.

If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Brown Act.

PROCESS FOR FILING A GRIEVANCE

Any grievance by a Stakeholder must be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall then within no more than 30 days refer the matter to an ad-hoc grievance panel comprised of 3 Stakeholders who are randomly selected by the Council Secretary from a list of Stakeholders who have previously expressed an interest in serving from time to time on such a grievance panel. The Secretary will coordinate a time and a place, not to exceed 10 days, for the panel to meet with the person(s) submitting a grievance and to discuss ways in which the dispute may be resolved.

Thereafter, a panel member shall promptly prepare a written report to be forwarded by the Secretary to the Board to be heard at the next board meeting outlining the panel's collective recommendations for resolving the grievance. The Board of Directors may receive a copy of the panel's report and recommendations prior to any meeting by the Board, but the matter shall not be discussed among the Board members until the matter is heard at the next regular meeting of the Board pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act.



This formal grievance process is not intended to apply to Stakeholders who simply disagree with a position or action taken by the Board at one of its meetings. Those grievances can be aired at the Board meetings. This grievance process is intended to address matters involving procedural disputes, e.g., the Board's failure to comply with the Board's Rules or Bylaws, or its failure to comply with the City's Charter, the Plan, local ordinances, state law, and/or federal law.

In the event that a grievance cannot be resolved through this grievance process, the complainant has the right to appeal the matter to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment for consideration or dispute resolution.
