- F Discussion, update, and possible Action with regards to working with community groups and coordination of WNC Committees to support efforts such as cleanup events including local parks, Los Angeles River cleanups by LA River Walkers and Watchers (larww.org) and on the last Saturday of each month; Friends of the LA River (FOLAR); Volunteers Cleaning Communities (<https://volunteerscleaningcommunities.com>) Adopt A Street programs and others tbd.

David: Would like to coordinate and support this effort.

- G Discussion and possible action with regards to issues relating to Winnetka as part of cooperation and outreach with CM Blumenfield and staff.
 - Consent from WNC regarding proposal for Runnymede Park's proposed change to "close one hour after sunset, open one hour before sunrise".

David motions to give consent for the proposal for changing Runnymede's closing time, Erick seconded.

Elizabeth: Still remains concerned with singling out Runnymede for this change.

Aaron: There does seem to be more incidents at this park in comparison to other parks. Trees have recently been trimmed.

Juan: Are there exemptions for use of the tennis courts or other programs or equipment?

Samantha: Largely does not like the idea of blocking the access of the community to the park.

Steven: Agrees with Samantha. Doesn't like the precedent.

Elizabeth: Does not like the precedent. Wants to see the approach of positive use of the park, rather than removing privileges.

Alex: Clarification of the hours change. Suggestion of having the change only inclusive on loitering rather than full closure.

Aaron: It would be up to the discretion of the LAPD officers to determine the misuse of the park after hours for citation.

David withdraws his motion.

Erick motions to table the issue.

Alex: Doesn't want to make a motion, but would like the recommendations of Aaron and the City team. Tabling for more info is appropriate.

Miran: Agree with tabling the motion. Should be able to get the Park & Rec report - to know what the ordinance changes.

Samantha: Agrees to tabling. SLO Poepke should be at that discussion.

Jonathan: Agrees that we should be able to have SLO Poepke and table the discussion. There are positive steps we can take.

- City Council actions relating to Ordinance [Section 41.18 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code](#) relating to use/maintenance of public right-of-way and Part 2 determinations and signage ([CF 20-1376-S1](#)) at locations such as Winnetka Park and alleys at Penfield (North of Roscoe, east from Winnetka) and behind businesses at N/W corner of Mason and Roscoe.

Aaron: To add a gate, a permit would be required, and a motorized gate would be about \$10,000. They would also need to get the consent of all of the residents impacted by the gate.

David: Is there still an issue at Winnetka Elementary?

Juan: There are people camping in front of a business that is closed near the school. Between the car wash and the old Boost Mobile that is closed.

Aaron: DeSoto and Van Owen land parcel is owned privately, and is separate from the senior living home nearby. The City has reached out to the owner, and at first were receptive. The Dept of Safety has been investigating the property for violations, and there is now a case file being reviewed by the City Attorney's office. Criminal filings may be issued against the property owner. The third party cleaning bill has been more than what they were willing to do. The City Attorney will likely need to take them to court, and potentially put a lien on the property. They may be able to re-acquire the parcel through this process. LAPD could then put up a no trespass sign. They've tried to get nonprofits to assist, but without success yet.

H Update on follow up/neighborhood action regarding RV parking and debris on Mason Street and proposed overnight parking prohibition.

David: They seem to have 100% participation in the local neighbors.

Aaron: Yes, they are proceeding with the overnight permits to be posted. As of last week, they had all signatures required. LAPD also submitted the letter of support. Traffic Study will likely be next. Once the traffic study is done, they will let us know the next steps.

RECONSIDERATION AND GRIEVANCE PROCESS

The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for Reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action.

If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a {Proposed} Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken can only make a motion for reconsideration.

If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a

memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Brown Act.

PROCESS FOR FILING A GRIEVANCE

Any grievance by a Stakeholder must be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall then within no more than 30 days refer the matter to an ad-hoc grievance panel comprised of 3 Stakeholders who are randomly selected by the Council Secretary from a list of Stakeholders who have previously expressed an interest in serving from time to time on such a grievance panel. The Secretary will coordinate a time and a place, not to exceed 10 days, for the panel to meet with the person(s) submitting a grievance and to discuss ways in which the dispute may be resolved.

Thereafter, a panel member shall promptly prepare a written report to be forwarded by the Secretary to the Board to be heard at the next board meeting outlining the panel's collective recommendations for resolving the grievance. The Board of Directors may receive a copy of the panel's report and recommendations prior to any meeting by the Board, but the matter shall not be discussed among the Board members until the matter is heard at the next regular meeting of the Board pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act.

This formal grievance process is not intended to apply to Stakeholders who simply disagree with a position or action taken by the Board at one of its meetings. Those grievances can be aired at the Board meetings. This grievance process is intended to address matters involving procedural disputes, e.g., the Board's failure to comply with the Board's Rules or Bylaws, or its failure to comply with the City's Charter, the Plan, local ordinances, state law, and/or federal law.

In the event that a grievance cannot be resolved through this grievance process, the complainant has the right to appeal the matter to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment for consideration or dispute resolution.
