If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

Erin for Mayor Bass: State of the Union is on the website. Inside Safe initiative. As of this week over 1100 individuals have moved to housing. Around 44 people from CD-3. A lot of them are moving toward permanent housing. Proposed City Budget is ongoing. LADWP Lifeline Program for senior citizens. Small Business opportunities. Youth Program as well.

SLO Poepke: Robberies are up, aggravated assaults are up, burglaries are down, GTAs are way down, property crimes are down.

Question on drownings - will be addressed by Fire Chief

Fire Chief Tom: Oversees Fire Station 104. One of three fire chiefs. 3000 calls in April - increase of about 13% from last year. They go on a lot of medical calls. They are looking for prevention - to try and prevent the need for medical calls. There was a drowning in Chatsworth. They want people to take pool safety seriously. Put fences around pools. With summer coming - plan safety for the pool.

About 100 calls a day at their station. Constant moving of resources throughout the day. Brush Fires cause extreme resource needs. Current Strategic Plan. LAFD.org

This Saturday is Fire Service Day from 11-4. There will be demonstrations at Fire Station 88 in Sherman Oaks. 4th of July is coming up as well. They are assisting LAPD in their calls as well.

What triggers both a fire truck and an ambulance? Once they get on scene, the situation is evaluated. They dispatch a fire truck and an ambulance to most calls.

Call load for structure fires has gone down.

Do you think you have the resources you need? It's a balancing act between budget and resources you need. If the homeless can be addressed - it may drop the increase in calls.

Question about hold times for 911: They do have texting. They are trying to address spikes in call

load.

Question about what is their responsibility: They are evolving and evaluating the resources that are available. They will do everything they can with the resources they have.

Pulse Point - broadcasts some of the incidents. They need an accurate address.

Evacuations and emergencies - everyone should practice and be prepared...Look on LAFD.org for tips on preparation.

Cell phone location: tracked by general area combined with the description of the relevant incident.

Question about preparedness classes at middle / high schools: They do not have programs as of right now.

Traffic Safety - more likely addressed by LAPD.

Alberto from Jesse Gabriel's office: Annual day of service on April 30 with about 1000 volunteers. Provided over 3000 hygiene kits. 600 sandwiches. 32 pints of blood donated. Cleanups. About 50 partner organizations.

Reach out with any questions.

Aaron from Bob Blumenfield's Office: Current projects - Runnymede Park has not yet started construction. Contractor had weather delays. This coming Monday is supposed to be the new start date.

Winnetka Park - security cameras / lighting project update. Rec & Parks forestry division issues have been resolved. They are supposed to begin soon - he will continue to follow up. Requests for additional tree coverage at Winnetka - A tree project proposal has been submitted. They are working with multiple agencies for a grant to allow purchasing / planting and maintenance for 2 years for trees at the park.

Mason Ave: remaining RVs - last one removed on May 4.

DeSoto / Vanowen private parcel: April 18 was the final date for compliance. The landowner removed all of the debris from the parcel. The owner has started parking cars on the parcel. LA City attorneys did not pursue actions as they did comply. Dept of Building and Safety does not need to fence in the property. There is a temporary fence. They are unsure of the use of the parcel for parking. Landowner lives in Beverly Hills. LAHSA is going to the Alley regularly. Some of the individuals have either relocated or been housed.

Community Events: Carnival LAPD West Valley coming up.

Councilmember's Office lost Michael Owens due to health conditions.

Safe Parking is still ongoing near Councilmember's office.

RECONSIDERATION AND GRIEVANCE PROCESS

The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for Reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action.

If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a {Proposed} Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken can only make a motion for reconsideration.

If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Brown Act.

PROCESS FOR FILING A GRIEVANCE

Any grievance by a Stakeholder must be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall then within no more than 30 days refer the matter to an ad-hoc grievance panel comprised of 3 Stakeholders who are randomly selected by the Council Secretary from a list of Stakeholders who have previously expressed an interest in serving from time to time on such a grievance panel. The Secretary will coordinate a time and a place, not to exceed 10 days, for the panel to meet with the person(s) submitting a grievance and to discuss ways in which the dispute may be resolved.

Thereafter, a panel member shall promptly prepare a written report to be forwarded by the Secretary to the Board to be heard at the next board meeting outlining the panel's collective recommendations for resolving the grievance. The Board of Directors may receive a copy of the panel's report and recommendations prior to any meeting by the Board, but the matter shall not be discussed among the Board members until the matter is heard at the next regular meeting of the Board pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act.

This formal grievance process is not intended to apply to Stakeholders who simply disagree with a position or action taken by the Board at one of its meetings. Those grievances can be aired at the Board meetings. This grievance process is intended to address matters involving procedural disputes, e.g., the Board's failure to comply with the Board's Rules or Bylaws, or its failure to comply with the City's Charter, the Plan, local ordinances, state law, and/or federal law.

In the event that a grievance cannot be resolved through this grievance process, the complainant has the right to appeal the matter to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment for consideration or dispute resolution.
