If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

- 5) **Our Guest Speaker – Deputy Mayor of Outreach, Jared Rivera.** The Deputy Mayor will be addressing various topics for around 15 minutes, followed by a Q&A from the board and general public.

- **Discussion regarding outreach methods**

Jared Rivera: Discussion of eviction notices - they have case workers who address this. They want community engagement.

Oversees DONE - application process went live today for a General Manager position. Application is online - at the personnel page at the City of Los Angeles. Publicize to a broad audience. Will be brought to a vote

before LA City Council by February.

Survey will be sent to all NCs about the general manager to gather input.

Fire under the 10 freeway - damage done is not structural. Anticipated 3-5 week period of disruption. Gov Newsom & The Mayor of LA have been coordinating the response. CalTrans owns most of the area.

Pallets under the freeways - is there a plan to address items under the freeway? They are investigating. The property was leased through a state lease, which was subleased possibly in violation of the lease. The location did not have a massive encampment at the location.

Inside Safe - housed over 17K individuals. Inside safe is targeting encampments - about 1800 people.

Interim housing is a huge piece of the housing solution (between 6-18 months)

Services are also a huge component - more are being sought

Permanent housing - there is a lot of work building permanent housing. Interim can get people document ready - having proof of having no money. Interim gets them a mailbox to get the needed documents as well as to get them assessed for what permanent housing they are eligible for.

Streamlining affordable housing.

Circle Program - mental health care - they are hiring more police officers. In Aug of 2023, they had the most applicants for LAPD in a long time. They are focusing on hiring within the city - and trying to speed up the process. There are great jobs at the City - apply. They want to fully staff the outreach teams.

Zoning within single family - they fixed the executive action to confirm that rezoning was not included. It was meant to streamline projects, not rezone or bypass zoning.

Public Works and outreach - concerns about funding to improve turnout. Need to evaluate how to spend resources to improve connections.

Empower training modifications - will be addressed with the next general manager

Policies getting in the way of connecting to schools - they are trying to get these blockades addressed.

Daniel for Supervisor Lindsey Horvath: 74 million for homekey funding. 47 million will be in district 3. Responded to anti LGBTQ hate.

They are working toward a Jewish protection plan - increase in anti-semitic hate.

Support of displaced Armenians.

Dec 5 - she will be sworn in as chair.

Dec 6, 3-6pm - Calabasas open house at their office.

Sidewalk vending - county guidelines. It is on their radar.

Aaron for Bob Blumenfield's office: Runnymede Park - final ribbon cutting this past Monday! Phase 2 is now in the designing stage. Picnic tables, awnings, other equipment.

Winnetka Park - security cameras - they are anticipating upgrades to be designed by Dec.

Planted 73 brand new trees.

They gave away 100 trees.

Holiday Drive - collecting toys

Dec 7 at the Winnetka Rec Center - food and light refreshments

Chamber of Commerce holiday donation toy drive Monday Dec 18 5:30-7:30pm.

Rent stabilization ordinance - tenant protections were put into place during covid. Today's vote by the City Council, allowed for the Feb 1, 2023, rentals subject to the stabilization ordinance can be raised 4-6%.

Draft Language to CIS:

We the Winnetka Neighborhood Council View with concern the historic underfunding of the Emergency Management Department. This is an essential service department dedicated to ensuring public safety in the event of earthquakes, wildfires, floods, riots, terrorist attacks and epidemics. We call for the city to adequately

fund the Emergency Management Department and fully support the Controller Ron Galperin's report of October 20, 2022 "A Better Plan to Get LA Ready".

The city's Resiliency Plan tasked NCs with producing emergency preparedness plans for their communities. So far, the city has offered little or no help, financial or otherwise, for these projects.

The Neighborhood Council Emergency Preparedness Alliance believes that help with these projects could be forthcoming if the city's Emergency Management Dept. were properly funded and staffed.

The Winnetka Neighborhood Council views with concern the historic underfunding of the Emergency Management Dept and calls on the city of Los Angeles to fund EMD adequately.

The Peer City Emergency Preparedness Programs Budget Comparison (FY2021-22) on page 7 of the Controller's Report shows the funding disparity between Los Angeles and other comparable jurisdictions.

RECONSIDERATION AND GRIEVANCE PROCESS

The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for Reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action.

If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a {Proposed} Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken can only make a motion for reconsideration.

If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Brown Act.

PROCESS FOR FILING A GRIEVANCE

Any grievance by a Stakeholder must be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall then within no more than 30 days refer the matter to an ad-hoc grievance panel comprised of 3 Stakeholders who are randomly selected by the Council Secretary from a list of Stakeholders who have previously expressed an interest in serving from time to time on such a grievance panel. The Secretary will coordinate a time and a place, not to exceed 10 days, for the panel to meet with the person(s) submitting a grievance and to discuss ways in which the dispute may be resolved.

Thereafter, a panel member shall promptly prepare a written report to be forwarded by the Secretary to the Board to be heard at the next board meeting outlining the panel's collective recommendations for resolving the grievance. The Board of Directors may receive a copy of the panel's report and recommendations prior to any meeting by the Board, but the matter shall not be discussed among the Board members until the matter is heard at the next regular meeting of the Board pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act.

This formal grievance process is not intended to apply to Stakeholders who simply disagree with a position or action taken by the Board at one of its meetings. Those grievances can be aired at the Board meetings. This grievance process is intended to address matters involving procedural disputes, e.g., the Board's failure to comply with the Board's Rules or Bylaws, or its failure to comply with the City's Charter, the Plan, local ordinances, state law, and/or federal law.

In the event that a grievance cannot be resolved through this grievance process, the complainant has the right to appeal the matter to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment for consideration or dispute resolution.
