- 6) **GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES:** Updates: The latest information from representatives of the offices of Mayor Garcetti, Councilman Bob Blumenfield (CM BB), Congressman Brad Sherman (CMN BS), State Senator Stern, State Assembly Jesse Gabriel, the LAPD, LAFD, LAUSD, Dept. of Neighborhood Empowerment General Manager Rachael Beltran or staff (DONE), Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC), and any other local, state, or federal agencies in attendance. [5 min each, 20 min max]

[Mayra Valadez, Field Representative for Jesse Gabriel, stated that Governor Newsom has until Sunday to sign all bills that are “on his desk”. He still has 9 bills he can sign with Assemblyman Gabriel writing 4 of them. Those are AB 330, AB 1132, AB 1198 and AB 1278. Ms. Valadez stated that Gabriel is holding an event at the Calabasas Civic Center to teach how to protect yourself against scammers \(Handout\). Gabriel will also be holding a dog adoption fair on October 26th at the Sepulveda Basin Off-Leash Park \(handout\).](#)

[Keith Banks, Field Representative for Councilman Bob Blumenfield, explained that there will be homeless encampment clean-ups at the rate of 2 per month per district. He stated that Blumenfield paid overtime for the additional cleanups. He stated that every district has a CARE Team of 6 people that will be working 5 days a week and going out to the homeless encampments to clean up the areas. There are also Care Plus teams of 8 people that do heavy duty clean ups where the clean up is posted 3 days prior to clean up \(handout\). These teams also have an officer on the team. If someone’s belongings are left, the team tags the items, leaves instructions at the site on how to retrieve and the items are sent to storage in downtown LA \(handout\).](#)

[Blake Clayton, Field Representative for County Supervisor, Sheila Kuehl, reports that the increase in street vendors and the accompanying issues is being discussed at the City and County level. All are aware of issues to public health and safety and are working on rules and enforcement. Due to budget constraints and the number of vendors the issue won’t be adequately addressed until 2020. If something illegal is seen people can still report to police. Ms. Vazquez states that she saw open flames, took pictures and reported the issue but nothing seems to have been done. Mr. Solis states that he doesn’t want the vendors to start being shut down since this is their income and they are part of our community. Mr. Clayton states that the emphasis will be on education vs. citation.](#)

[Jasmine Elbarbary, DONE Advocate, reports that the new manager is doing a listening tour of all Neighborhood Councils. Also, DONE is gearing up for the 2020 Census and states that Winnetka has a few red tracts \(areas that are hard to count\). Mr. Solis asked for DONE to work with Blumenfield’s office.](#)

[Robert Jackson, Representative for LAUSD Board Member, Scott Schmerelson, reports that Schmerelson will be having an open house on 10-23-19 \(handout\) and on 10-17-19 he will be at UCLA for College Day. Also, Community Advisory Committee applications are being accepted \(handout\).](#)

Mikkei Lei, with SOLID, reports that the 24th Annual Pasta Dinner to raise funds for LAPD-Devonshire Area, will be held on October 11th from 5-8pm at St. Nicholas Greek Church (handout). Also, Devonshire Basic Car Neighborhood Watch will have its October meeting on the 17th at 7pm at The Garden Church (handout). A speaker will be addressing the vaping epidemic.

Eric Marchena, a Private Developer, will be putting in a Grocery Outlet at the prior Fallas retail building on corner of Sherman Way and Corbin Ave. He wanted to introduce himself and let us know about the intention for that vacant building. Issues with homeless encampments was mentioned and Mr. Marchena states that fencing, etc. is being installed to address the issue. Mr. Solis stated that the private property can be registered with LAPD and a police unit will patrol regularly. Mr. Uebersax suggested that a presentation can be brought to the PLUM committee and asked Mr. Lace to help coordinate a committee meeting.

RECONSIDERATION AND GRIEVANCE PROCESS

The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for Reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action.

If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a {Proposed} Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken can only make a motion for reconsideration.

If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Brown Act.

PROCESS FOR FILING A GRIEVANCE

Any grievance by a Stakeholder must be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall then within no more than 30 days refer the matter to an ad-hoc grievance panel comprised of 3 Stakeholders who are randomly selected by the Council Secretary from a list of Stakeholders who have previously expressed an interest in serving from time to time on such a grievance panel. The Secretary will coordinate a time and a place, not to exceed 10 days, for the panel to meet with the person(s) submitting a grievance and to discuss ways in which the dispute may be resolved.

Thereafter, a panel member shall promptly prepare a written report to be forwarded by the Secretary to the Board to be heard at the next board meeting outlining the panel's collective recommendations for resolving the grievance. The Board of Directors may receive a copy of the panel's report and recommendations prior to any meeting by the Board, but the matter shall not be discussed among the Board members until the matter is heard at the next regular meeting of the Board pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act.

This formal grievance process is not intended to apply to Stakeholders who simply disagree with a position or action taken by the Board at one of its meetings. Those grievances can be aired at the Board meetings. This grievance process is intended to address matters involving procedural disputes, e.g., the Board's failure to comply with the Board's Rules or Bylaws, or its failure to comply with the City's Charter, the Plan, local ordinances, state law, and/or federal law.

In the event that a grievance cannot be resolved through this grievance process, the complainant has the right to appeal the matter to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment for consideration or dispute resolution.
