➤ **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** [5 min]

- We will review and approve the May Minutes if available. **(WNC-2019-061119-01)**
- Mr. Uebersax asked if everyone had time to review the minutes. Several board members requested more time. Approval of May minutes was tabled until July to give time for review.

➤ **GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES** [5 min each, 20 min max]

- Updates: The latest information from representatives of the offices of Mayor Garcetti, Councilman Bob Blumenfield (CM BB), Congressman Brad Sherman (CMN BS), State Senator Stern, the LAPD, LAFD, LAUSD, Dept. of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE), Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC), and any other local, state, or federal agencies in attendance.
- Gibson Nyambura, Empower LA Advocate, announced that a representative from DONE will be attending monthly Neighborhood Council meetings. He reported that there are several staffing changes, most notably, Gracie, who is leaving for a new position. A new General Manager will be hired soon.
- Keith Banks, Field Representative for Councilmember Blumenfield, announced the homeless (unsheltered) count for District 3 is 900 for 2019. Last year it was 607. Ordinance 8502, allowing people to sleep in vehicles, has been extended for 6 months. Keith, also, announced that a bike lane was added on Winnetka and a crossing signal was added near IAC Shepar where a pedestrian was killed. These changes are part of the Mobility 2035 plan.
  - A Stakeholder asked about a illegal marijuana dispensary near her. Mr. Banks stated he is aware of that dispensary and it is now gone. Once illegal dispensaries are identified by LAPD they ask LADWP to cut off power. He added all agencies are trying to coordinate efforts to shut these operations down.
  - Mr. Fuhman asked about the many street vendor "pop-up restaurants". Mr. Banks stated those vendors must comply with the ADA, have a permit through the county, have no attached wires to electrical grid, have trash receptacles and running water. He said that the city is sending out crews from 5pm-10pm to inspect vendors. Mr. Banks added that a \$200 fine is given for infractions.
- Mikkie Loi, LAPD Representative, announced the event Coffee with the Captain on June 20<sup>th</sup> at 9am at Starbucks in Porter Ranch (flier made available). Another event happening soon is National Night Out on August 6<sup>th</sup> from 6pm to Sunset at Northridge Recreation Center. WNC can have a table and 2 chairs. We can let her know if we want to participate. Set up is at 4pm. At sunset is a movie.

- Mr. Fuhman made a Stakeholder announcement that LAPD and CHP are recruiting for 911 Dispatcher positions. Due to hiring freeze ending many positions are available. There is a one-year paid training and a 6 month probationary period. Requirements are 18 years and older and ability to type 32 wpm. The annual pay is about \$50-86,000. Currently, there are only 20 Dispatchers for a population of 4 million. A tour of West Valley Dispatch Center is available for those considering applying.
- Zafir Molena discussed a sustainability program she would like to start with school children to discuss the destruction of Earth and what people are consuming and to advocate for healthier options in the Winnetka/Canoga park area.
- Joe Philips with the Sierra Club made an invite to the annual Sierra Club Spaghetti dinner on June

18<sup>th</sup> from 6pm-10pm.

**RECONSIDERATION AND GRIEVANCE PROCESS**

The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for Reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action.

If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a {Proposed} Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken can only make a motion for reconsideration.

If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Brown Act.

**PROCESS FOR FILING A GRIEVANCE**

Any grievance by a Stakeholder must be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall then within no more than 30 days  
WNC\_Agenda

refer the matter to an ad-hoc grievance panel comprised of 3 Stakeholders who are randomly selected by the Council Secretary from a list of Stakeholders who have previously expressed an interest in serving from time to time on such a grievance panel. The Secretary will coordinate a time and a place, not to exceed 10 days, for the panel to meet with the person(s) submitting a grievance and to discuss ways in which the dispute may be resolved.

Thereafter, a panel member shall promptly prepare a written report to be forwarded by the Secretary to the Board to be heard at the next board meeting outlining the panel's collective recommendations for resolving the grievance. The Board of Directors may receive a copy of the panel's report and recommendations prior to any meeting by the Board, but the matter shall not be discussed among the Board members until the matter is heard at the next regular meeting of the Board pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act.

This formal grievance process is not intended to apply to Stakeholders who simply disagree with a position or action taken by the Board at one of its meetings. Those grievances can be aired at the Board meetings. This grievance process is intended to address matters involving procedural disputes, e.g., the Board's failure to comply with the Board's Rules or Bylaws, or its failure to comply with the City's Charter, the Plan, local ordinances, state law, and/or federal law.

In the event that a grievance cannot be resolved through this grievance process, the complainant has the right to appeal the matter to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment for consideration or dispute resolution.
